Position Summary:

We are seeking a full-time, permanent Psychologist or Psychological Associate to provide psychological services.

The successful candidate will practise as a regulated health professional, be professionally accountable for their clinical work in accordance with the standards, guidelines, and ethical principles of the College of Psychologists and Behaviour Analysts of Ontario (CPBAO), and work within a multidisciplinary treatment environment.

Schedule:

In-person – Monday to Friday, 8:30 am to 5:00 pm (40 hrs/week).

Compensation:

Psychological Associate: CAD 100,000-CAD 130,000 per year, commensurate with experience and qualifications.

Psychologist (Ph.D. or Psy.D., eligible for autonomous practice): CAD 120,000-CAD 160,000 per year, commensurate with experience and qualifications

The position includes a comprehensive benefits package and pension plan.

Responsibilities:

1. Conduct psychological assessments and produce integrative reports summarizing the findings and conclusions of the multidisciplinary assessment team.
2. Conduct individual and group psychotherapy within a multidisciplinary clinical setting.
3. Develop and deliver educational and psychoeducational workshops that support the clinical goals, treatment approach, and scope of Southdown's programs for clients, stakeholders, and target populations in the wider community.
4. Carry out the above duties and responsibilities in a manner consistent with the Guidelines for Professional Practice and Ethical Principles of the CPBAO.
5. Participate in on-call rotation as assigned.

6. Participate in appropriate staff committees of Southdown.
7. Engage in ongoing professional development consistent with identified priorities of the organization.
